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
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MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT




These are not isolated efforts, but parts of a larger picture: a community where prevention is woven into every layer of support.


As you read through this report, I hope you feel the same sense of optimism and possibility that inspires us each day. Together, we are proving that prevention is not only possible—it is powerful.














Streching Every Dollar Further!

CPO is funded 39% at \$4,132,356 with federal funds received from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services provided by the Missouri Department of Social Services, Missouri Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, 5% at \$508,571 by other federal funding, and 56% at \$5,960,206 by other non-federal sources.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING & HOMELESS PREVENTION

Our Affordable Housing & Homeless Prevention Division works to ensure safe, decent, and affordable housing for everyone.

By convening partners and resources, we reduce barriers to housing, prevent homelessness before it starts, and increase financial stability in our community.

This is prevention in action — strengthening the foundation of our neighborhoods and creating lasting change together.

Programs that Put Prevention in Action

O'Reilly Center for Hope

Welcomed an average of **873 guests** each month, connecting them to housing, food, and essential resources that prevent homelessness.



HOME-ARP Shelter Diversion

Helped **94%** of participants remain housed and **84%** feel confident in keeping their housing through targeted support and financial assistance.

One Door

Completed **1,371** housing assessments, connecting **503** households to shelter or long-term housing programs.

Low Income Housing Tax Credit Supportive Services

Distributed **6,000+ pounds** of fresh produce, launched community refrigerators in food deserts, and empowered residents to lead volunteer and civic engagement efforts — reducing food insecurity and strengthening neighborhoods.

From Stranded Abroad to Safe at Home

After 13 years stranded overseas in unsafe conditions, a woman returned to Springfield, determined to start over. She was living in a roach infested motel with sewage water leaks. With CPO's help, she found work. transportation, and her first apartment — and has remained safe and stably housed.

Fighting Eviction During Cancer Treatment

A couple facing eviction after a cancer diagnosis received rental assistance and landlord mediation. allowing them to keep their home and continue lifesaving medical care.

Community **Collaboration Spotlight**



🖔 Crisis Cold Weather Shelters

- Opened 60 nights, sheltered an average of 205 people per night, leveraged **\$520,000** in donated space, and mobilized 1,931 volunteer shifts. This lifesaving effort was made possible through the dedication of more than 400 volunteers, the generosity of local host sites, and essential support from community partners such as City Utilities Transit, Salvation Army, and Freeway Ministries. Together, we ensured that our most vulnerable neighbors had a warm, safe place to sleep on the coldest nights of the year.



The Community & Neighborhood Development Division works to improve the social, economic, physical, and environmental well-being of our neighborhoods, schools, and communities — from crime prevention and food security, to neighborhood cleanups and community engagement.

Neighborhood Cleanups

From Fall 2024 through Spring 2025, 12 cleanup events served 24 Springfield neighborhoods, preventing hazards, blight, and environmental harm by removing over 70 tons of waste.



Expanded recycling—including electronics, scrap metal, cardboard, and bicycles—kept valuable materials out of the landfill, strengthening neighborhood pride and creating cleaner, safer communities.



By the Numbers

- 151.25 tons of waste disposed
- 79 dumpsters of waste removed
- 25 dumpsters of brush recycled
- 28 tons of metal recycled
- 849 TVs & computers recycled
- 260 volunteers gave 996.25 hours

Nourish the Ozarks

Through a three-year USDA grant from the MO Department of Social Services, Nourish the Ozarks (NTO) partners with local farmers and community organizations to prevent food insecurity before it deepens.

By purchasing and redistributing fresh, locally grown food to marginalized communities in 17 Missouri counties—including four of the state's most food insecure—NTO strengthens local economies while ensuring families have access to nutritious food.



- Served 48,703 people
- Hosted 720 distributions
- Distributed 72,423 lbs. of fresh, local produce



National Night Out 2024

Nearly 2.000 residents connected with first responders and community partners, building relationships and sharing resources that prevent crime and strengthen neighborhood safety.

School-Based Social Work

With just two social workers, we served 839 students and parents across 25 schools, providing case management, crisis assistance, and **311** resource connections for food. housing, clothing, and utilities.

Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA)

Free, IRS-certified tax prep for households under \$67K/year

- **6,077** returns filed (record high)
- \$6M in refunds returned to the community
- \$40M+ total economic effect

Making Sense of Money

Financial education to build budgeting & savings habits

- 332 people served
- 88.6% graduation rate
- 95% of graduates use a budget (up from 40%)
- 90% are saving money (up from 42%)

Student Development

Mentor SGF

Provides life skills, social-emotional growth, and academic support through mentoring, after school clubs, and enrichment programs.

- 1,624 students served (↑ 68%)
- 1,753 engagement opportunities (↑ 47%)





Bulldog Basketball Academy

Basketball training + life skills.

- 374 students served across 12 sites
- 97% said coaches care & want them to succeed
- 93% said they learned to introduce themselves

New Program Highlight:

Child Care Works!

CPO is leading the way with Childcare Works, a groundbreaking, public-private partnership designed to enhance Missouri's child care system. This program will share costs equally between the state, employers, and families—making high-quality care affordable for those who earn too much for subsidies but still struggle with market rates. This innovative approach will help parents stay in the workforce, support local businesses, and give children the strong start they deserve.



PREVENTION & YOUTH SUPPORT

The Prevention & Youth Support Division leads efforts across Southwest Missouri to prevent substance misuse, reduce suicide, and promote mental wellness. Through community coalitions, youth leadership, evidence-based education, and targeted awareness campaigns, we work alongside schools, families, and partners to create safer, healthier communities.

Strategies in Action



Awareness in Action

Campaigns like Caught Clowning and Minor-Miner educated more than a million residents on alcohol misuse. Partnerships with media outlets also brought vital fentanyl awareness messaging to households across the region.

Ripple Effects in Communities

Our Firearm Suicide Prevention Initiative inspired the U.S. Veterans Administration to start a similar program for high-risk veterans. In Taney County, suicide prevention network membership doubled, and more than **1,000 people** received QPR lifesaving training in one year.



Breaking Stigma & Inspiring Hope

CPO partnered with organizations across 17 Missouri counties to advance suicide prevention, promote mental health, and inspire hope. From Talk to Remember's record attendance to Borrow My Angel's first awareness video, to Ripple Effect Mapping and firearm safe storage initiatives, each effort broke down stigma, built connection, and put prevention into action.

SAFE& SOBER

NEW PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT

We are proud to welcome Safe and Sober into our Prevention & Youth Support Division! Based in Springfield, this 501(c)(3) nonprofit shares our mission to prevent substance misuse and build healthier communities.

- Covers underage drinking impaired driving, vaping, prescription mususe & more
- Focuses on root causes like stress, depression & anxiety

Mental Health First Aid

- 25 MHFA trainings provided to 376 people
- 6 youth MHFA trainings provided to 116 people
- 5 trainings to 203 local first responders



COMMUNITY COLLABORATIVES

CPO's Community Collaboratives identify gaps, set goals, and drive long-lasting, positive change. The Council of Collaboratives, made up of each collaborative's leadership, fosters cross-collaboration to address a broad range of community issues. Together, these partnerships put Prevention in Action — creating stronger, healthier communities across the Ozarks.









IMPACT unique organizations represented **SNAPSHOT:** 3.008 volunteer hours contributed

Health Equity Collaborative

- Conducted a countywide Health Equity Survey to identify gaps in healthcare access.
- Partnered with MSU for data review and applied for funding to expand participation incentives.

Child Abuse & Neglect Collaborative

- Expanded prevention and intervention for youth experiencing domestic violence and sexual abuse.
- Hosted the Go Blue Kick-Off to raise awareness and promote resilience, healing, and advocacy.

Early Care & Education Collaborative

- Partnered with Kids Win to address infant/child care access, engage businesses and philanthropy, and connect parents to childcare openings.
- Hosted Big Rig Night, Community Wide Play Day, and community trainings for child care providers.

Housing Collaborative

- Adopted a 2023–2026 strategic plan
- Hosted All About Tenants, a universal design workshop, and advocacy efforts for housing priorities.

Environmental Collaborative

- Helped Springfield become a Clean City Community through the Ozarks Clean Air Alliance.
- Partnered on local environmental projects and shared grant opportunities.

Food Collaborative

- Expanded Nourish the Ozarks to 17 counties, sourcing food from local farmers.
- Installed community fridges in Springfield, providing free produce and fresh food access.

Let's Go Smart: Transportation Collaborative

- Hosted Walk & Talks and a Bike & Talk for Bike, Walk. and Wheel Week.
- Partnered with MSU to track and improve local trail development.

Have Faith Collaborative

Hosted Mayor's Luncheons and the Festival of Faiths. connecting 27 faith groups and 18 nonprofits.

Funded for Impact

With seed funding from Missouri Foundation for Health & the City of Springfield, created Theory of Change with 5 focus areas:

- Deterrence
- Public Awareness
- Education & Community Engagement
- Data Collection
- Supportive Services



Building the Collaborative

- Launched in 2023 after Springfield Police Chief convened 17 community leaders.
- Expanded to 60+ members representing law enforcement, nonprofits, faith leaders. and residents of the most impacted neighborhoods.

Intervening in Real Time

Street Outreach Workers deployed in May 2025 to de-escalate high-risk conflicts and prevent



- Youth-led survey: 100+ responses from ages 13-24 shaped programming priorities.
- Safe Space Created: The Action Center at Heart of Hope Church welcomed 1,000+ youth in 9 months.
 - -Freestyle Fridays (music, rap, poetry)
 - -Man Talk Tuesdays (men's dialogue on violence & healing)
 - -Youth-led concerts and visioning sessions
