The requested funds support a dedicated FTE staff position to support the CoC's evaluation of CoC and ESG funded projects. The CoC has implemented an objective and transparent system for funded projects. This system is based on quarterly monitoring of projects' spending (compliance and timeliness), CES involvement, and project performance via review of HMIS reports and e-LOCCS reports. This process informs the ranking of projects for federal funding allocations. The CoC and HMIS Lead also regularly monitors CES for efficiency, effectiveness, and equity through bi-monthly case conferencing meetings and agency/project participation reports for all projects based on adopted CES policies and procedures (which outline required participation levels, timeliness, training, and process for accepting referrals). Lastly, the CoC works with projects to facilitate coordination with mainstream partners to address barriers to accessing and maintaining safe, decent, and affordable housing with a specific focus on sub-populations (Veterans, youth, survivors of domestic violence etc).
