

Learn how your family can get a P-EBT benefit for your child

Pandemic-Electronic Benefits Transfer (P-EBT) is a one-time benefit that helps families cover food costs for children who qualify for free or reduced lunch at school but are not in school due to the pandemic.

You may be able to get P-EBT benefits if you have a child or children in grades Pre-Kindergarten through Grade 12 who would have received free or



reduced price meals at school if schools were holding in-person classes.. A family that has lost income may also be able to get a P-EBT benefit, even if a child did not previously get free or reduced price meals.

How does it work?

- If your household received Food Stamp (SNAP) benefits <u>in March</u>, this week you will automatically get \$302 for each eligible child added to your EBT card.
- If you did not get a Food Stamp (SNAP) benefit in March, you will need to
 apply and provide income information for March, April, and May. You will receive
 a letter <u>NEXT WEEK</u> from your school district with the P-EBT application and
 additional information.
