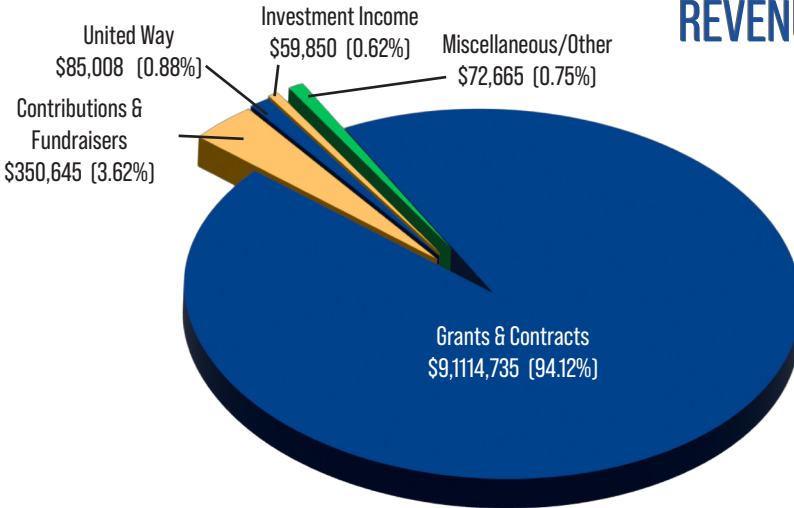

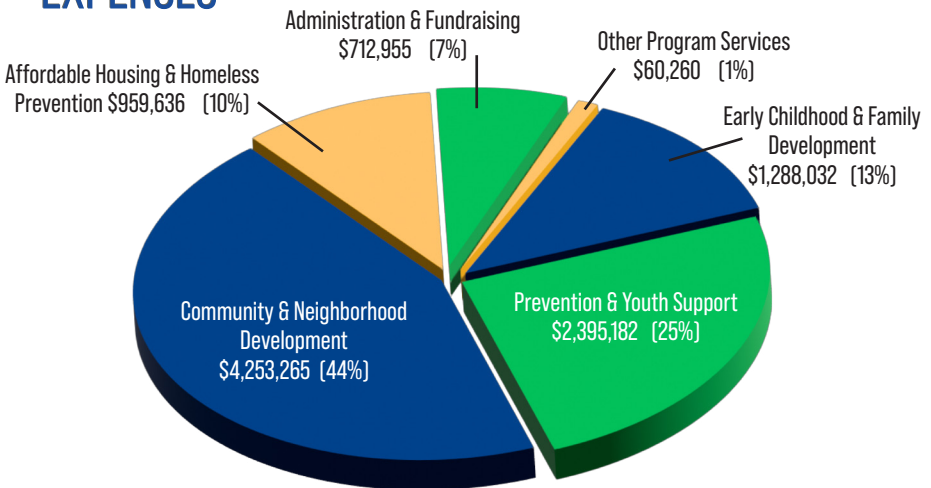

Cultivating community is at the heart of the work we do at CPO and last year we created some amazing new partnerships and developed some important new initiatives.

At the end of last year, we launched Nourish the Ozarks program, which will allow us to deliver fresh produce and other foods to 17 counties across Southwest Missouri to help reduce food insecurity. We will partner with Springfield Community Gardens, Ozarks Food Harvest, OACAC, and other partners in this new initiative.

We developed new partnerships with two organizations, Multicultural Business Association (MBA) and Borrow My Angel (BMA), bringing both under the CPO umbrella. We will work with MBA to help local multicultural businesses build capacity for success and growth, promoting economic development and employment in the community. Our partnership with Borrow My Angel will help develop a comprehensive strategic plan that will expand our efforts and create positive impact around the critical areas of mental health awareness and suicide prevention.

Cultivating community was definitely the priority when partnering with the NAACP Springfield to plan and host the first ever city-wide, weekend long Juneteenth Celebration! Over three days, more than 1,500 people attended the series of events offered across the community that weekend.

These are just a few examples of the important work that happened last year at CPO. I've lived in many different places, and our community is like no other. I am so proud of the way we work together to create the community we all want to live in! That's only possible through hard work, dedication to collaboration, and being willing to set aside differences for the greater good. At CPO, we are blessed with an incredible staff, board, and volunteers, and I am grateful for the opportunity to work with them everyday!

Wow it's been another exciting year to be a part of Community Partnership of the Ozarks! I continue to be so impressed by the amazing work that CPO accomplishes for our community. CPO is a wonderful team of leaders and staff that are dedicated to the building of resilient children, healthy families, and strong neighborhoods & communities.

To expand on this year's annual report theme, CPO has certainly cultivated community in the last year:

- Our team served or impacted over 86,000 people;
- They recruited and worked with 9,259 volunteers that invested almost 57,000 hours of their time to helping meet our mission;
- Through donations of time and resources, they leveraged an additional \$13,383,665 to support our community! That's a return of investment of \$21.95 or 2,195%!

As the go-to organization for addressing red flag issues and other community needs, CPO cultivates community in everything they do, and collaboration is the foundation. We couldn't make the positive impact we make without our collaborative partners!

Our focus is broad but that helps us be poised to respond quickly when issues emerge in our four key areas of Affordable Housing & Homeless Prevention, Community & Neighborhood Development, Early Childhood & Family Development, and Prevention & Youth Support. We have a proven track record of tackling the problems that impact our families and the communities we serve, and we are proud of that.

While the past few years have been more difficult than ever, we have a long history of resiliency during hard times, and the success of CPO is due to the hard work and dedication of our wonderful staff, community partners, board members and volunteers. We are so thankful and blessed to have the support of so many and look forward to next year as we continue to build the community we all want to live in!

COMMUNITY AND NEIGHBORHOOD DEVELOPMENT

We provide a wide range of services to improve the social, economic, physical, and environmental well-being of our neighborhoods, schools, and our community.

STUDENT DEVELOPMENT



BULLDOG BASKETBALL ACADEMY

We served 236 students, doubling the number of students involved from last year. 96% of students said coaches helped them understand the importance of hard work and feel the coaches want to see them succeed.

SAAB: BROTHER-2-BROTHER

We support this program that is dedicated to ensuring students have the support needed to excel academically, socially, and professionally. This is offered through individual middle school, high school, and college chapters in Springfield. There were 167 students participating across 15 local chapters. We provided 27 suits for students as a part of our Black Suit Initiative and iPads to graduating seniors.





AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS

We served 554 students through after school clubs such as Cooking Club, Step Team, Piano Club, and more. These clubs provide unique opportunities for students to learn a new skill, develop confidence, and bond with their teachers outside of a structured classroom.

SMALL GROUP AND ONE-ON-ONE MENTORING

We provided small group and one-on-one mentoring to 92 students. This gave the students consistent positive role models that help increase their self esteem, confidence and motivation to thrive.

SOCIAL WORK



We provide school-based and community-based social work to give flexible support to families in need. Our team advocates, assesses needs, provides education, refers to services, empowers families, and works every day to improve the lives of people in our schools and communities.

COMMUNITY-BASED SOCIAL WORK

Social workers promote not only human well-being, but also the well-being of the community. Our Community-Based Social Work services provide support and empowerment while helping individuals and families meet basic needs. Our Community-Based Social Worker served **284 individuals and 156 families**.

TRANSPORTATION SUPPORT

We were awarded \$55,000 from Community Foundation of the Ozarks' Let's Get to Work fund to provide financial support for those facing transportation barriers that impacted their ability to get hired or get to work. We served **44 people** through our Transportation Support Project.

SCHOOL-BASED SOCIAL WORK



We partner with Springfield Public Schools to offer social work services at every school in the district. This provides flexible support to kids and families in our schools and community.

COMMUNITY COLLABORATIVES

These Collaboratives - Child Abuse and Neglect, Early Care and Education, Environmental Sustainability, Food, Health Equity, Housing, and Let's Go Smart: Transportation Collaborative - identify gaps and create goals to make long lasting positive change. Last year the Collaboratives had 125 different members representing 63 organizations that donated 1,462 hours.



NEIGHBORHOOD DEVELOPMENT

NEIGHBORHOOD CLEAN-UPS

We facilitate neighborhood clean-ups for city recognized neighborhood associations in Springfield. These allow residents to dispose of yard waste, old furniture, construction debris and much more, free of charge. This provides a service to the community and helps keep our neighborhoods clean!

WE PROVIDE DAYS OF HOPE AT THE O'REILLY CENTER FOR HOPE. THESE FREE ONE-DAY EVENTS BRING FOCUSED SERVICES AND RESOURCES TO A SINGLE LOCATION TO REMOVE BARRIERS AND INCREASE COLLABORATION AMONG AGENCIES. THESE EVENTS PROVIDE UNIQUE SERVICES ALONG WITH SUPPORT FROM PARTNERS TO OFFER RECURRING SERVICES INCLUDING HEALTH SCREENINGS, RESOURCE NAVIGATION, AND MORE.

ONE DOOR



WHEN FACING A HOUSING CRISIS, UNDERSTANDING AND NAVIGATING THE SYSTEMS OF SERVICES CAN BE CONFUSING AND OVERWHELMING. ONE DOOR ASSISTS IN MANEUVERING THROUGH THOSE CRUCIAL SYSTEMS BY PROVIDING A CENTRAL POINT OF ENTRY FOR COORDINATED INTAKE, ASSESSMENT, AND REFERRALS FOR HOUSING AND SHELTER SERVICES IN OUR COMMUNITY.

ONE DOOR SUCCESS STORY

Tim and his dog, Peanut Butter, were homeless and living in their car. Tim came to the O'Reilly Center for Hope to find housing and was appreciative that he could "go there and take a shower, I can do my laundry, I can receive my mail there, get snacks, hygiene products." After completing an assessment through One Door, they found a home for Tim and Peanut Butter. Tim still visits the O'Reilly Center for Hope often to check in and say hello. On the staff at the O'Reilly Center for Hope, Tim said beyond helping him find a home:

"They have taught me respect for myself, they taught me that I am loved."

Every winter, overnight Crisis Cold Weather Shelters open in our community to provide additional emergency shelter beds. We work with local churches, organizations, and volunteers to ensure that everyone has a safe place to go during freezing temperatures.

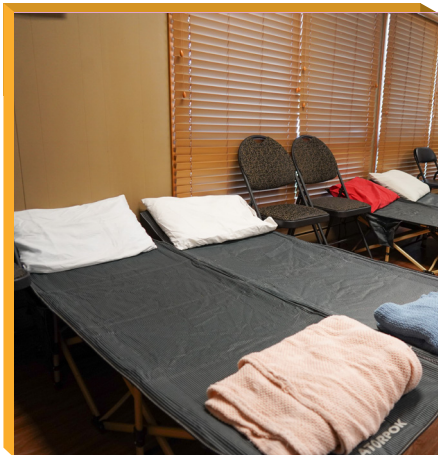

PREVENTION AND YOUTH SUPPORT

We coordinate and support mental health awareness and suicide prevention, as well as substance use and misuse prevention efforts across 21 counties in Missouri.

Suicide Prevention and Mental Health Support

SUICIDE IS THE SECOND LEADING CAUSE OF DEATH FOR MISSOURIANS AGE 18-24 AND THE THIRD LEADING CAUSE OF DEATH AMONG YOUTH AGE 10-17. ROUGHLY 1 IN 10 STUDENTS IN MISSOURI REPORTED THAT THEY HAD PLANNED SUICIDE. OUR TEAM PROVIDES TRAINING, RESOURCES AND SUPPORT TO HELP INDIVIDUALS AND COMMUNITIES COLLABORATIVELY ADDRESS THESE ISSUES.

WE TRAINED 16 NEW SPRINGFIELD PUBLIC SCHOOLS STAFF TO IMPLEMENT SIGNS OF SUICIDE TRAINING. THIS LED TO SIGNS OF SUICIDE TRAINING BEING PROVIDED TO MORE THAN

6,800 6TH-9TH GRADE STUDENTS



MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID

We provide Adult, Youth and Teen Mental Health First Aid that teaches participants how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders. Last year, we facilitated and supported the training of:

FIREARM SUICIDE PREVENTION

WE ARE WORKING ON FIREARM SUICIDE PREVENTION IN CHRISTIAN, GREENE, HOWELL, AND TANEY COUNTIES. OUR EFFORTS ARE FOCUSED ON INCREASING COMMUNITY AWARENESS OF THE PREVALENCE OF SUICIDE BY FIREARMS, DECREASING ACCESS TO FIREARMS AS LETHAL MEANS FOR SUICIDE, AND INCREASING COMMUNITY COLLABORATION AROUND FIREARM SUICIDE PREVENTION.



HOME SAFETY KITS

We distributed more than 1,000 home safety kits. These include a medication/handgun lock box, drug destruction packets, a firearm cable lock, and literature on suicide and opioid misuse & overdose prevention.

Building Stronger Communities Through Coalitions

We provide technical assistance, training and support to 21 counties across Missouri to help decrease their substance use and related problems. We assist these coalitions as they work collaboratively to make their communities a better place. We support 23 coalitions including five newly registered coalitions in Greene, Christian, Taney, Texas and Howell Counties.

Developmental Assets Building More Resilient Children and Healthier Families

Development Assets is a framework that introduces people to a collection of experiences and qualities that act as a guide for adults as we create environments, provide opportunities, engage in relationships and instill personal strengths that our young people need to succeed.

FIRST BIRTHDAY

Our First Birthday Program serves families who are in their 3rd trimester or have a child who is up to 6 months old that does not have a safe sleep option. Our home visitors serve 28 counties in Southwest Missouri and provide safe sleep education along with a pack-n-play for each family.

FIRST BIRTHDAY SUCCESS STORY:

We served a mom that lives in a rural community and needed a safe place to sleep for her child. She had a crib but couldn't use it due to complications during birth. We provided a pack-n-play the same day we received the referral, traveling 110 miles each way to ensure the baby had a safe sleep option for that night. Mom was beyond thankful. She kept saying thank you and how much she appreciated us responding so fast.

FAMILY FOCUSED NETWORK

Our Family Focused Network is a new program that offers a coordinated referral and intake system to help families access home visiting programs across a 47 county service region. It is our goal to ensure that all families that want to participate in a home visiting program are served by a program that best fits their families' needs.

Capable Kids and Families strives to fill the gap in services for children with special needs and their families. We work to empower parents and families while focusing on children's potential for development.



HEALTHY FAMILIES

SUCCESS STORIES

We had a family enroll in the program that had recently lost custody of their children and were working to reunify. We worked with them on home cleanliness and organization, mental health, self-care, and Conscious Discipline techniques, while also helping with supervised visits. They regained custody of their children and their case with Children's Division was closed.

We worked with a single mom of 3 that did not have stable housing. With the help of our CPO emergency assistance fund, we helped with the deposit and first month's rent to get them into a new home.



The Healthy Families Program works with families to provide resources, support, and education in the parent's home. 70% of our Healthy Families referrals come from Children's Division for families involved with the child welfare system.
